
Schools Faraway 2021,




Dolma Gurung – we are waiting for her diploma of completing the six-year basic course and we keep our fingers crossed for further decisions.

Master's studies:






Karma Choesang – there are still two years of master's studies ahead of him.








Wangyal Gurung must draw. Even in a pandemic times. In the fall, he started a course in contemporary painting.

Higher Secendary School, Pokara




